0. Two is Better Than One

Write a PHP file called `stutter.php` that takes a `$_GET` parameter called `word` and outputs its stuttered form in plain text. A stuttered word has each of its characters duplicated once, maintaining character order from the original word.

Example:

```
http://somebaseurl/stutter.php?word=pikachu  
http://somebaseurl/stutter.php?word=aLAKaZAM
```

Requests with these query parameters to `stutter.php` should produce the following output, respectively:

```
Your word stuttered is: ppiikkaacchhuu  
Your word stuttered is: aaLLAAkkaaZZAAMM
```

When outputting plain text in PHP, you will need to include the following line after computing the result and before printing it as a string (recall that this tells the client what kind of data is returned from your PHP web service, which in this case, is plain text):

```
header("Content-Type: text/plain");
```

If the query is absent from the url, then nothing should be output in the method.
