<u>Part 1</u>: Read Chapter 1 of Agile Processes, by Robert C. Martin, distributed in class and found online at: <u>www.objectmentor.com/resources/articles/agileProcess.pdf</u>. Answer the following 2 questions.

Q1 (2 x 5 =10 points): Which two Agile principles do you believe would have the *most* positive impact to your 403 project development if you adopted them? For each principle, describe what it means, how you would apply it, and its potential impact.

Q2 (2 x 5 = 10 points): Which two Agile principles do you believe would have the *least* impact to your 403 project development. For each principle, explain why it would have lower impact, describe a project for which it would have a significant impact, and why.

Part 2: Read Chapter 3 of Rapid Development, by Steve McConnell.

Q3 (5 points): What are the two most significant classic mistakes that you could envision occurring in your 403 project development? How will you avoid them?
