





- 59% of second-generation Asian Americans speak the language from their familial country of origin worse than 'pretty well'.







Each user should have their own tablet.





 - "Hey Buddy..."






When a new person speaks, the group score goes up.


You can also earn points by suggesting words when someone is struggling or using vocabulary someone else suggested to you.


